

Pupil Premium at Water Hall Primary

The pupil premium is funding given to schools to support pupils who are considered 'disadvantaged.' and to close the gap between them and their peers. The current funding is £1,300 per pupil given to the school annually, if a child has been eligible for FSM within the previous 6 years.

Behaviour Mentor

We support pupils with challenging behaviour to achieve academically through the provision of our Behaviour Mentor to provide interventions to pupils.

Aim: To ensure that behaviour is not a barrier to academic achievement, providing a positive male role for many of our pupils

Teaching Assistants

We support our pupils academically through the provision of Teaching Assistants

Aim: Supporting pupils successfully in class to access Quality First Teaching and to provide interventions to pupils.

Interventions

We support our pupils through the delivery of high quality interventions that help to address any gaps or misunderstanding in learning to prevent pupils from 'falling behind'

Aim: For the attainment gap between PP and Non PP pupils to be reduced and sustained over time.

Staff CPD

Well trained staff understand the strategies that they can employ in the classroom to support their PP pupils.

Aim: Increased teacher confidence in delivering Quality First Teaching to Pupil Premium children.

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School Visits

School visits, residentials, coach journeys etc. funded by the school to ensure access to a wide variety of opportunities and activities.

Aim: To raise aspiration, motivation and engagement, improve behaviour, give a purpose and support academic studies and extend experiences.

Breakfast Club

Our free breakfast provides a safe welcoming environment to ensure that our pupils are well prepared and set up for the day with a nutritious breakfast.

Aim: To support a healthy lifestyle for pupils and ensure they are prepared for the school day.

Extra Curricular Activities

Priority access to our extra curricular activities and clubs. We signpost children towards out of school opportunities and will consider funding/partial funding of these in some instances.

Aim: To promote equal access to activities and promote a healthy lifestyle

Music Lessons

Music lessons are available to pupils and PP should not be a barrier to this. School will consider funding music lessons for PP pupils, where they are committed and interested in the opportunity.

Aim: To promote equal access to activities, increase self-esteem, improve fine motor skills. To provide a range of opportunities to children who would not otherwise be able to partake in them

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Counselling

Our school counselling service supports PP pupils as a priority.

Aim: To promote a support network for children who may not meet the threshold of wider services and teach skills to support emotional literacy.

Parental support

Signposting to support services, accompanying parents to Parent consultations etc.

Aim: Parents access high quality information and support from a familiar setting

Additional funding

We ensure that our PP pupils have access to school uniform and equipment if needed.

Aim: To promote a sense of well-being and belonging to the school community.

Family Support Team

Our highly skilled and knowledgeable Family Support Workers support our PP families, as a priority, with attendance, punctuality, accessing additional support, food banks, clothing and furniture support etc.

Aim: To provide a support network for families and provide QFFI (Quality First Family Intervention)

Emotional Wellbeing

Emotional Literacy Support Assistants trained to support pupils in school.

Aim: To promote a support network for the most vulnerable children and teach skills to support emotional literacy.
